M: Jesus Christ is the light of the world,


C: the light no darkness can overcome.

C: and hear our evening hymn of praise.





C: Through your Word and Spirit may our souls be blessed.

- M: Yet I am always with you; you hold me by my right hand.
- C: You guide me with your counsel, and afterward you will take me into glory.
- M: Whom have I in heaven but you? And earth has nothing I desire besides you.

LESSON ISAIAH 12


In that day you will say:



PRAYER FOR ADVENT SEASON




